Reflection Questions: How thirsty am I for God? How is this longing expressed in my life? What song do I sing when the darkness comes? What questions do I ask myself when I feel spiritually dry? How do I overcome my nights of darkness and despair? Where do I put my hope? If I was unable to corporately worship God, would it bother me? Am I committed to worship regularly with my church family?

How can we pray for one another and our church this week?


