
- 1. What in the text/sermon impacted you most? Encouraged you? Convicted you? Challenged you? Confused you?

- 6. How can the Bible be God's Word when John states that Jesus is *the Word* (*John 1:1*)?

- 8. If a neighbor were to tell you that he didn't believe the Bible because it is full of errors, how would you respond?
- 9. When reading the Bible, do you look at the footnotes dealing with text variants? Why or why not?
- 10. When faced with apparent contradictions in the Bible (i.e. 2 Samuel 8:4 and 1 Chronicles 18:4) or with notes that say the oldest and best manuscripts don't include a portion of our Bible (i.e. Mark 16:9-20; John 7:53-8:11; 1 John 5:7) is your faith shaken? Why or why not?
- 11. When we claim that the Bible is inerrant what do we mean?
- 12. If we believe the Bible is inerrant has it become an idol to us? Explain.
